FUNK/JAZZ IT IS WHAT IT IS Thundercat ****

Like a modern-day George Clinton. bass virtuoso Thundercat breathes afro-futurism and jazz-funk stylings into everything he touches, including his fourth and latest album. The American musician, whose real name is Stephen Lee Burner, even connects the past and future of funk on Black Qualls - a track that features singer Steve Arrington from 1970s funk band Slave, guitarist Steve Lacy from modern R&B band The Internet and hip-hop star Childish Gambino.

Sure, he shows off his musicianship and bass fingerwork on tracks like How Sway, but he also lets the quirks shine through on tracks such as I Love Louis Cole.

The tribute to Cole features the multi-instrumentalist himself, pounding away hurriedly on the drums as Thundercat's hazy vocals drift along an intriguing contrast that culminates in a

sweeping string section finale.

Despite the joyousness, the undertone of loss is apparent – Thundercat mourns his friend, rapper Mac Miller, who died of a drug overdose in 2018.

Several songs reference coping, like Miguel's Happy Dance, where he sings "it's okay, it's time to dance away your pain", and a 51-second skit called Existential Dread ("I'm not sure of what's coming next, but I'll be alright as long as I keep breathin"').

Somehow, the music feels appropriate for these uncertain times.



ONE WORLD: TOGETHER AT HOME


You might have already seen the at-home mini concerts livestreamed by Coldplay frontman Chris Martin and R&B singer John Legend in the past weeks.
