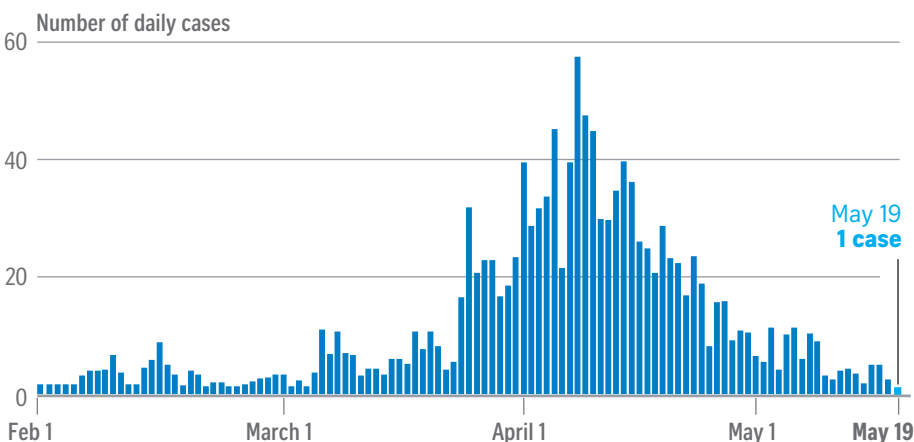


Covid-19: Where we stand now

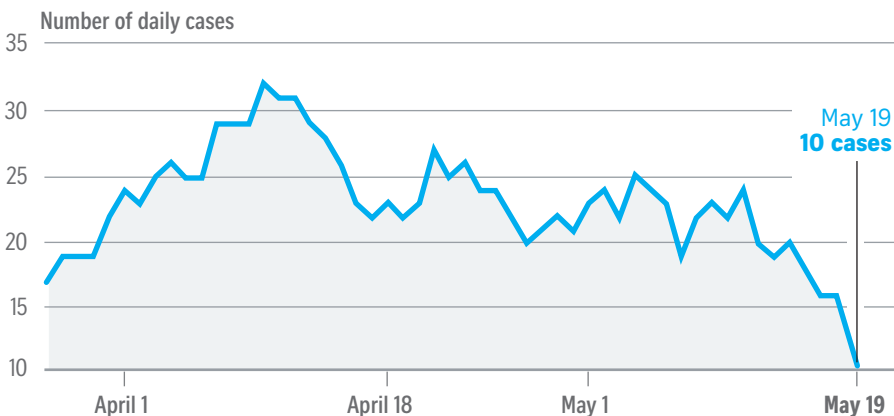
As Singapore prepares to lift circuit breaker measures after June 1, the numbers look optimistic. The number of community cases reported daily is one of the lowest since March and the number of patients in intensive care has dropped to the lowest since late March.

TREND IN COMMUNITY CASES

Community cases exclude work permit holders not in dorms, dorm residents and imported cases.

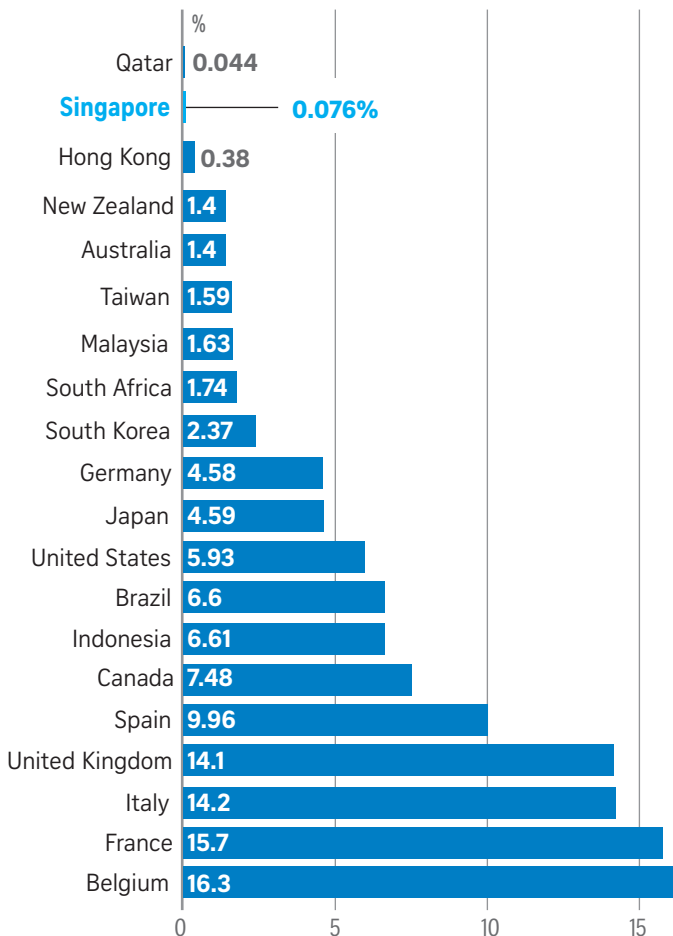


TREND IN ICU CASES



CASE FATALITY RATIO (CFR)

The Republic also has one of the lowest case fatality ratios in the world – an indication of how likely a Covid-19 patient will die in the country. This is because most patients in Singapore do not get critically ill, the healthcare system is able to provide adequate support, and doctors can intervene early and swiftly should complications arise.



- CFR is the ratio of Covid-19 deaths over the total number of confirmed cases in each location or country.
- Places with higher ratios have proportionally more deaths to the total number of confirmed cases, but this does not necessarily mean that the actual number of deaths is higher.
