

Widespread unrest

Rioting over the death of a black man in police custody hit at least 48 US cities on Saturday night, the second consecutive night of countrywide protests. The demonstrations, some violent, saw more curfews imposed by US mayors than at any time since the assassination of Dr Martin Luther King Jr in 1968. Here are some of the major flashpoints:

MINNEAPOLIS

Curfew imposed at 8pm on Saturday. National Guard mobilised. Dozens of arrests.

CHICAGO

Curfew imposed "until further notice". Thousands march towards Trump International Hotel and Tower before dispersing, vandalising buildings and police vehicles.

NEW YORK CITY

Thousands march in Harlem, Brooklyn, Queens and outside Trump Tower in midtown Manhattan. Street melees in Brooklyn, with police using billy clubs and pepper spray.

DENVER

Curfew imposed on Saturday. Arrests made.

LOS ANGELES

Citywide curfew. Police cars and buses set on fire. Stores looted. Beverly Hills also imposes dusk-to-dawn curfew.

FERGUSON

Police department damaged as protesters shoot fireworks, hurl bricks and rocks. Curfew imposed.

ATLANTA

Curfew imposed. CNN headquarters vandalised, police attacked.

PHILADELPHIA

Curfew imposed. Thousands march, with fire set to establishments and police cars.

WASHINGTON, D.C.

Chanting crowds clash with Secret Service outside White House, reporter attacked. Fires set in Lafayette Park, just steps from White House. The National Guard has been called out.

PITTSBURGH

Citywide curfew imposed. Rioting and looting takes place.
