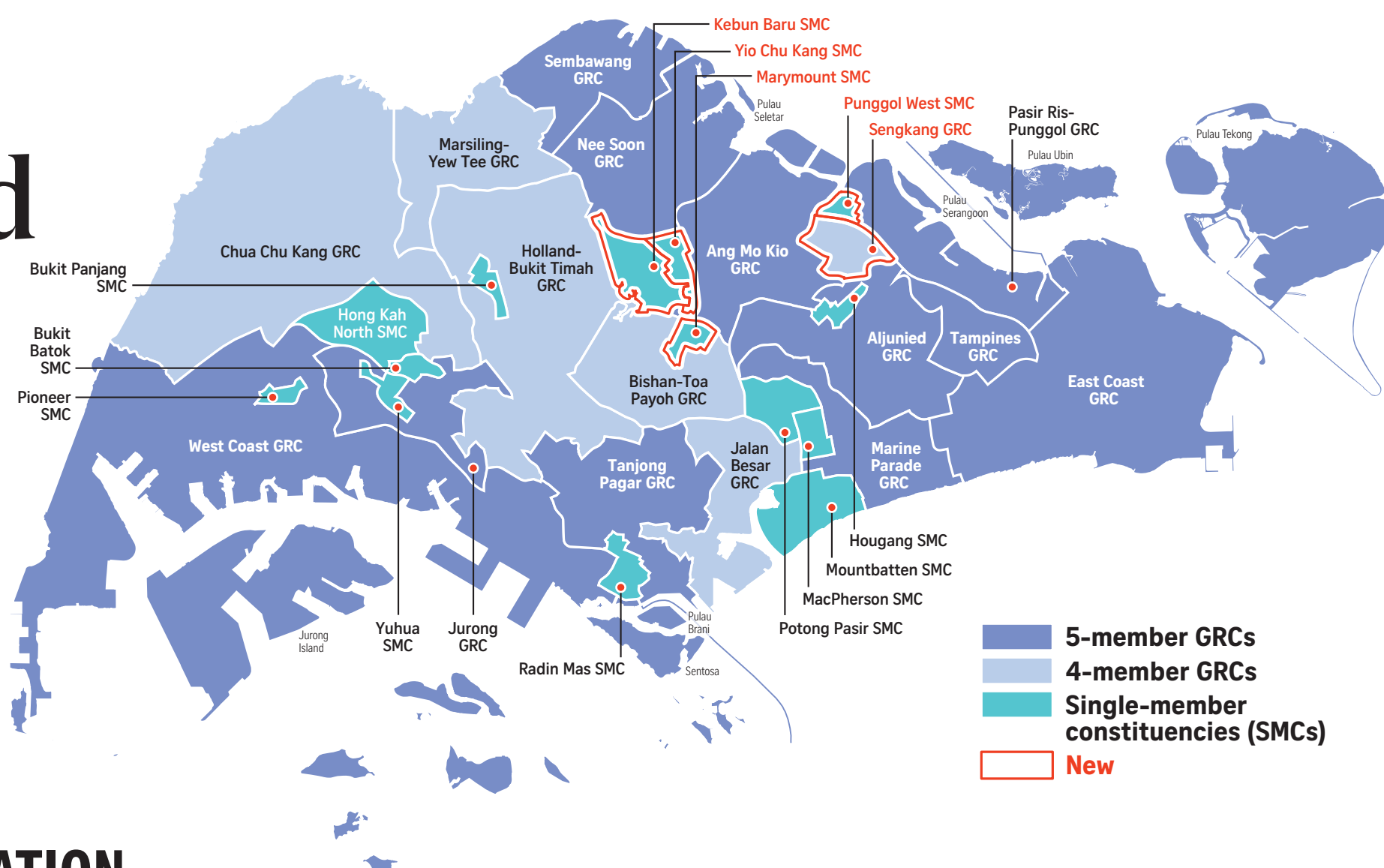

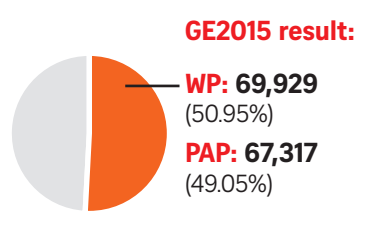

- The WP team consisted of Chen Show Mao, Sylvia Lim, Low Thia Khiang, Md Faisal Abdul Manap and Pritam Singh. The PAP team consisted of Chua Eng Leong, Murali Pillai, Victor Lye, Shamsul Kamar and Yeo Guat Kwang.

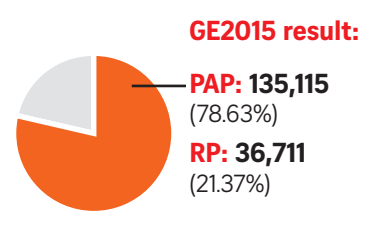

- Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong made his 1984 electoral debut in Teck Ghee SMC, which was absorbed into Ang Mo Kio GRC in 1991. He has stood as a candidate in the constituency since.
- In the latest revision of the electoral boundaries, the constituency went from having six members to five after Yio Chu Kang SMC was carved out of it. It also took in parts of Sengkang West SMC.
- In GE2015, the PAP team won with 78.6 per cent of the votes, well above the party's national average of 69.9 per cent, against the Reform Party.
- The PAP team consisted of Lee Hsien Loong, Ang Hin Kee, Darryl David, Gan Thiam Poh, Intan Mokhtar and Koh Poh Koon. The RP team consisted of Goh Keow Wah, Jesse Loo, Roy Ngerng, Osman Sulaiman, M. Ravi and Siva Chandran.

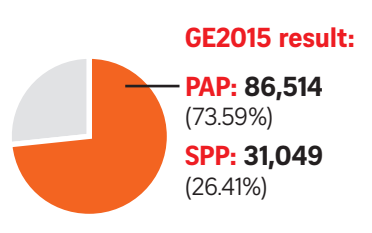

- In GE2015, the PAP team of Ng Eng Hen, Chee Hong Tat, Chong Kee Hiong, Saktiandi Supaat and Josephine Teo won with 73.6 per cent of the votes against the SPP team of Law Kim Hwee, Bryan Long, Mohamad Abdullah Zamzuri, Mohamad Hamim Aliyans and Benjamin Pwee.

- The PAP is fielding first-time candidate Yip Hon Weng, who is up against PSP's Kayla Low, also a new face.
- In GE2015, the PAP team in Ang Mo Kio GRC won with 78.6 per cent of the votes against the RP.

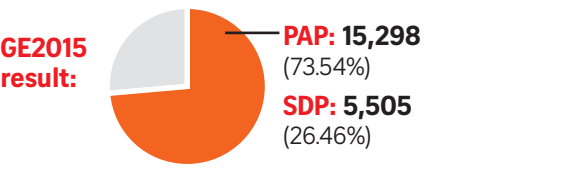

A LOOK AT THE TWO PREVIOUS GENERAL ELECTIONS

GE2011, when the PAP won with its lowest vote share of 60.1 per cent since independence, and GE2015, which featured a nail-biting contest in Aljunied GRC, which the Workers' Party held with just 2,626 votes, were two elections with plenty to take in.
