

Social distancing rules in South Korea

Level 2 (Aug 23 - 29)*



- No gatherings or meetings of more than 50 people indoors, 100 outdoors.
- No spectators allowed for sports events.
- Online learning for kindergartens and schools (except high school seniors preparing for exams in December).

- Closure of indoor public facilities and 12 high-risk private facilities including bars, karaoke clubs and Internet cafes.
- Telecommuting encouraged for civil servants and private company workers.
- Online worship for churches.

*Level 2 was imposed in Seoul and greater Seoul on Aug 19, then extended to the whole country on Aug 23.

Level 2.5 (Aug 30 - Sept 6)



- All restaurants and eateries to close for dining in at 9pm. Takeout and delivery from 9pm to 5am.
- All cafe chains to operate on takeout only.
- No gathering at indoor sports facilities, including golf simulators and billiards.

- No gathering of more than 10 people at private academies and study cafes.
- Mandatory quarantine rules (temperature checks, visitor log) at facilities such as water parks, indoor wedding halls, cinema, and funeral halls.
- No visits to nursing homes.

Level 3



- No gatherings or meetings of more than 10 people.
- Prohibition of sporting events.

- More businesses will be ordered to shut.
- More workers to telecommute.
