

Safer Cyberspace Masterplan 2020 at a glance

Several initiatives to be rolled out from now to 2023 underscore the importance of a collective response by the Government, businesses and individuals to protect Singapore's digital assets.



A new Internet Cyber Hygiene Portal will let businesses check instantly if their Web domains, e-mail systems and Web connectivity are in the pink of health. Self-help guides and toolkits will also be available for download by businesses.



A new Cyber Fusion Platform will provide the authorities with early warning against malicious attacks by analysing voluminous online data at great speed, using artificial intelligence technologies.



A new Internet of Things Threat Analytics Platform will detect and predict impending, large-scale IoT attacks. This will allow the authorities to take pre-emptive strikes against attackers.



A cyber security label can be voluntarily stuck on Wi-Fi routers and smart home hubs to help consumers make informed buying decisions. The label indicates whether the device makers ensure default passwords are not used, among other assessment criteria.
