 Cameramen, videographers and reporters start to gather. Dozens of journalists receive McDonald's treats from the King through his private secretary outside the palace gates.

10.25am

11.30am

2pr

- Mr Anwar holds a news conference at Le Meridien hotel.
 He claims he has 120 MPs on his side and that the King has been given "documents" to back up his assertion.
- Tengku Razaleigh Hamzah, 83, chairman of Umno's advisory board, meets the King and leaves 45 minutes later.

2.30p

 The palace issues a statement saying Mr Anwar presented to the King the number of MPs supporting him, but did not furnish their names.

 Prime Minister Muhyiddin Yassin holds a Facebook Live session for an hour with local media, saying he wants to focus on fighting Covid-19 and the struggling economy, not the palace meeting.

round 7pm

 Former premier Mahathir Mohamad says in a one-minute video that he is not endorsing any individual as prime minister.

1pm

Umno issues statement that it might consider pulling out of ruling alliance Perikatan Nasional, unless it gets new terms of working together in writing.
