

Latest curbs

1 LONDON

- People have been banned from mixing with other households indoors, starting on Oct 16

2 IRELAND

- Non-essential stores, bars and restaurants will close for at least six weeks from today
- Travel will be further restricted, with people told to stay within 5km of their homes

3 PARIS AND EIGHT OTHER FRENCH CITIES

- Residents must stay home between 9pm and 6am for four weeks with effect from Oct 17

4 MADRID

- Partial lockdown in and around the Spanish capital after a 15-day state of emergency was invoked on Oct 9
- No non-essential movement in and out of the city of Madrid and several nearby municipalities
- Bars and restaurants operate at 50 per cent capacity and must close at 11pm local time

5 SWITZERLAND

- Masks are required in public indoor spaces from Monday this week, and people are required to wear them at train stations, airports, bus and tram stops
- Gatherings of more than 15 people in public places are banned

6 ITALY

- Restaurants have to close by midnight and limit the number of people per table to six
- Bars have to close at 6pm unless they can offer table service to seated customers
- Arrivals at schools are staggered to help with social distancing

7 SLOVENIA

- Curfew from 9pm to 6am starting yesterday
- Public gatherings limited to six people
- All but essential travel between the country's 12 regions is banned

8 CZECH REPUBLIC

- Bars and restaurants are closed except for takeout orders
- Schools have moved to distance learning

9 BERCHTESGADENER LAND DISTRICT OF BAVARIA, GERMANY

- People are not allowed to leave their homes without valid reason for two weeks from yesterday
- Schools, restaurants, bars, theatres, gyms, cinemas and hotels are closed

10 BELGIUM

- All restaurants, bars and cafes remain closed for four weeks, starting on Monday this week
- A curfew from midnight to 5am also takes effect

11 SOUTH KOREA

- Starting on Oct 12, nightclubs, karaoke outlets and buffet restaurants have been allowed to reopen
- Churches and stadiums are allowed to fill 30 per cent of seating capacity, but catering services and small group gatherings in church are still banned
- High-risk activities such as door-to-door sales businesses remain banned

12 HONG KONG

- Social distancing rules will be relaxed with up to 50 people at weddings and no more than 30 in local tour groups starting on Friday

13 KUALA LUMPUR, PUTRAJAYA, SELANGOR AND SABAH

- A conditional movement control order is in place from Oct 14 to 27, prohibiting inter-district and inter-state travel
- Only two people from each household are allowed to leave home to shop
- Schools, daycare centres, entertainment outlets and recreational centres are closed

14 JAKARTA

- A two-week "transitional" period of eased curbs from Oct 12 allows non-essential businesses to work from offices, but making use only of half their capacity
- Dine-in customers at restaurants are limited to 50 per cent of capacity
