

Old Hill Street Police Station



- Built in 1934, it amplified police presence in the city centre and enabled the force to target secret society activities in Chinatown.

Pearl's Hill Upper Barracks

- Constructed together with the Lower Barracks, the Upper Barracks was used as government offices after World War II.

Pearl's Hill Lower Barracks

- Now a historic site, the Lower Barracks was first built to house the Sikh Contingent in 1934.

Former Traffic Police (TP) Headquarters

- This building was home to the Traffic Police for 69 years from 1930. It was refurbished and is now the Maxwell Chambers Suites.

Criminal Investigation Department Headquarters

- Built to house the Detective Department, the predecessor of the CID, this complex was once dubbed the "Scotland Yard" of

Malaya, after the headquarters of the London Metropolitan Police.

- The building was demolished in 1993.

Police Heritage Trail



First Police Office

- The first 12 policemen in Singapore reported to work at an attap house near the Singapore River.

Kreta Ayer Neighbourhood Police Post



- The only two-storeyed neighbourhood police post in Singapore, the Kreta Ayer NPP used to house the former North Canal Road Post Office.

Police Courts

- It stood opposite the old Central Police Station, and police prosecutors dealt with a wide range of criminal cases from within. It was demolished in 1975.



Central Police Station

- Nicknamed "Yit Hor Mata Chu", or "Number One Police Station" in Hokkien, the building has stood through some of Singapore's most dramatic historic events, including World War II.
