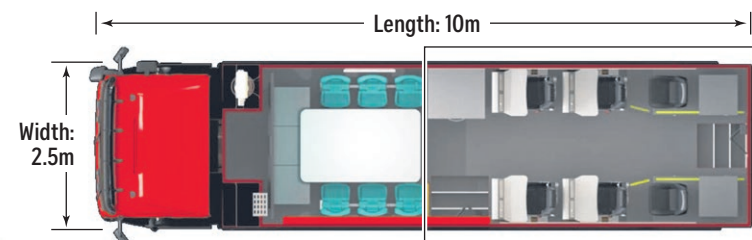


# New mobile command posts

In its annual workplan seminar, the Singapore Civil Defence Force (SCDF) unveiled its new forward command vehicles (FCVs) and command vehicles (CVs). These new models will be progressively put into operation from July this year, to replace its ageing fleet.

## FORWARD COMMAND VEHICLE

Deployed for incidents which call for an **enhanced response**, such as a factory fire, where a division commander is involved as the incident manager



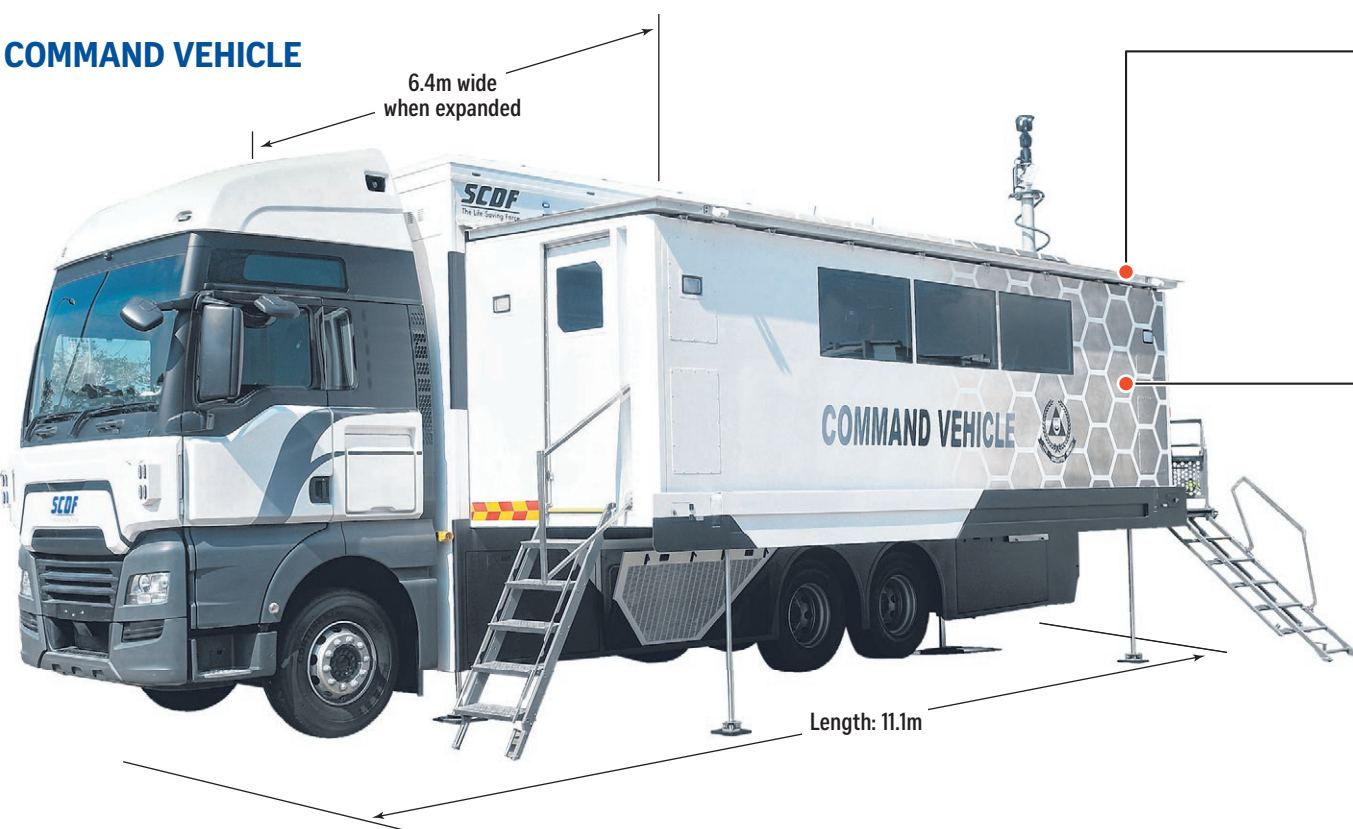
Individual workstations in its operation area are **equipped with seat belts**

## COMMAND VEHICLE



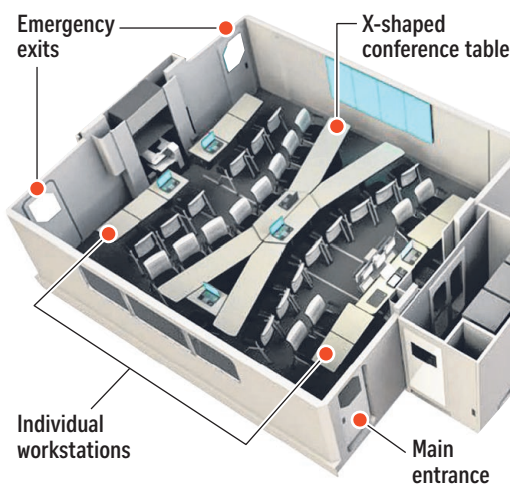
Deployed for **major incidents**, such as an air crash or a structural building collapse, where the SCDF Commissioner is involved as the crisis manager

Can be deployed in **under 20 minutes**

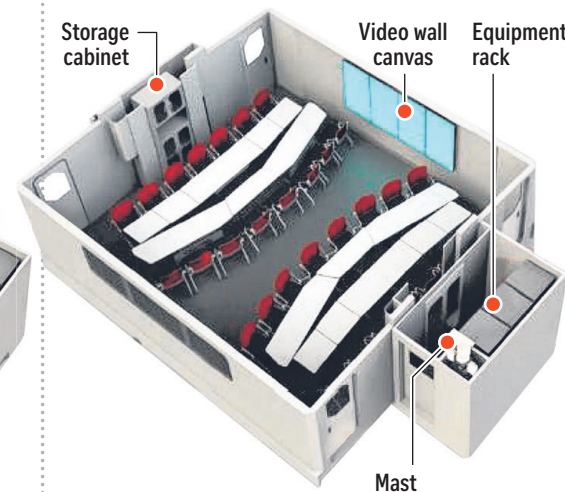


It has **two variants**. Each has a different interior layout and can switch between two configuration modes.

• SCDF operational systems



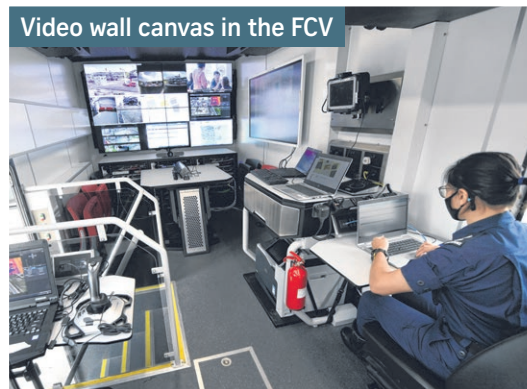
• Unmanned aerial vehicle
