Covid-19 clusters in Singapore

There are nine open community clusters in the country, and the largest is the Tan Tock Seng Hospital cluster, with 27 cases so far. Shabana Begum and Clara Chong give you the details.



- Philippine national, 46, nurse at TTSH's Ward 9D
 - Symptoms started on April 27
- Cases include patients from Wards 9C and 9D. discharged patients from Ward 9D. TTSH staff. visitors to Ward 9D. a physiotherapist at Ward 9D and a doctor at the National Neuroscience Institute, aged 18 to 98
- One of the patients. an 88-year-old woman, died from Covid-19 complications on May 1



- Singaporean, 38, **Immigration and** Checkpoints **Authority (ICA)** officer deployed at **Changi Airport Terminal 1**
 - Tested positive on April 27
- Seven other family members, aged three to 72, including his wife, father and nephew and his close contact, who is an ICA officer at the Home Team Academy



VISITOR CLUSTER



- arrived from India to visit his family member, who is a permanent resident
- Tested positive on April 16



WESTLITE WOODLANDS DORMITORY CLUSTER



- Bangladeshi national, 35, stavs at Westlite **Woodlands Dormitory** and is a construction supervisor at **Sembcorp Marine Admiralty Yard**
 - Tested positive on April 19

BUNKER TANKER CLUSTER



- - Indonesian national. 39. member of sea crew on board bunker tanker MT ALLI
 - Tested positive on April 16
- Five other Indonesian men. aged 24 to 45, who are his colleagues on the ship



OM UNIVERSAL CLUSTER



- Indian national, 43,
 - work pass holder First assessed to be a recovered case, but about two weeks later. tested positive again
 - · Likely to have been reinfected in India before arriving in Singapore
