

Enhanced safety measures

HOMES SERVING ELDERLY RESIDENTS

(Include Welfare Homes and Adult Disability Homes)



All outings, such as going on home leave or going out with a caregiver, are suspended. Exceptions include when a family member is critically ill.



Only two pre-designated visitors are allowed per resident. Only one visitor can enter the home at any one time, limited to a maximum of 30 minutes each time.



Only white-listed volunteer-led activities that cannot be done remotely, among other considerations, are allowed with safe management measures. Examples include dental care and cutting hair.



Up to five volunteers are allowed at a home at any one time. Volunteers should not visit multiple homes or centres.



Staff should not leave the home (if they are staying there) or their residence except for essential needs. Family members of staff are encouraged to avoid crowded places, other than their workplace or school.



Split teams and split zone arrangements for all staff have been reinstated from May 3. There should be no cross-deployment across worksites.

HOMES SERVING NON-ELDERLY RESIDENTS

(Include Children's and Young Persons' Homes, Children's Disability Homes and Singapore Boys' Home)



A maximum of two designated visitors are allowed, with precautions in place.



Volunteer-led activities may continue with no more than five volunteers within each home at any one time.



Where applicable, a limited home leave – where residents go back to their own residence for a period of time – may be allowed.
