Two-tiered relaxation of Covid-19 curbs

By Aug 9, about 70 per cent of the population here are expected to have received two doses of the Covid-19 vaccine. As a result, restrictions will be eased in two stages, on Aug 10 and 19. TIMOTHY GOH looks at the major changes:

From Aug 10



- Up to two allowed to dine in at coffee shops and hawker centres regardless of vaccination status
- Up to five allowed to dine in at other eateries if all diners are fully vaccinated'
- Certain exceptions for children**

GROUP SIZES

- People can gather in groups of up
- · Households will also be allowed to receive five distinct visitors per day. The cap on visitors does not apply to grandchildren being cared for by their grandparents
- Unvaccinated people are strongly encouraged to remain in groups of two or fewer

CONGREGATIONAL AND WORSHIP SERVICES

- Up to 500 worshippers may attend services if all are fully vaccinated*
- This limit is reduced to 50 worshippers if any are unvaccinated
- Certain exceptions for children**
- Vaccinated performers may sing while unmasked or play instruments that require expulsion of air, subject to safe management measures

FUNERALS

• Up to 30 attendees allowed at funerals at any point in time on all

LIVE PERFORMANCES

- Up to 500 may attend if all are fully vaccinated*
- This limit is reduced to 50 if any are unvaccinated
- Certain exceptions for children**
- Vaccinated performers may sing while unmasked or play instruments that require expulsion of air, subject to safe management measures

STAYCATIONS

- There can be up to five people per room in a hotel, subject to the room's maximum capacity
- Exceptions are made if people are from the same household

SOLEMNISATIONS AND WEDDING RECEPTIONS

- Up to 500 people may attend wedding solemnisations if they have all been fully vaccinated'
- If not, this limit is reduced to 50
- Certain exceptions for children**
- Up to 250 people may attend wedding receptions if they are all fully vaccinated*
- Only one reception will be allowed
- · Group sizes will be capped at five attendees per table

IN-PERSON TUITION AND ENRICHMENT CLASSES

- Up to 50 allowed per class in groups of up to five people
- Classes are strongly encouraged to be held online

SPECTATOR AND PARTICIPATORY SPORTS EVENTS

- Up to 500 people may attend these events if they have all been fully
- If not, this limit is reduced to 50
- Certain exceptions for children**

• These businesses can receive up to five unique visitors a day

CINEMAS

- Up to 500 people may be in the audience if they are all fully vaccinated.
- If not, this limit is reduced to 50
- · Food and drink may be served in groups of up to five if all customers are vaccinated
- Certain exceptions for children**

MICE EVENTS

- Up to 500 people may attend these events if they have all been fully vaccinated*
- If not, this limit is reduced to 50
- They may unmask at these events, subject to safe management measures
- Certain exceptions for children**

MASSAGE ESTABLISHMENTS AND **HAIR SALONS**

 Services which require masks to be removed, such as facials, saunas and make-up services, allowed to resume if customer is vaccinated

HOME-BASED BUSINESSES

• Up to 1,000 worshippers may

WORKPLACES A

- Up to 50 per cent of employees who can work from home may return to the workplace
- Workplace social gatherings will also be allowed

TEMPERATURE SCREENING

 Temperature screening will no longer be a requirement in public

CONGREGATIONAL AND WORSHIP SERVICES V

LIVE PERFORMANCES

- Group size limit for a fully vaccinated* audience will be increased to 1,000 attendees
- It will remain at 50 if some attendees are unvaccinated and there is no pre-event testing
- Certain exceptions for children**

MUSEUMS AND PUBLIC LIBRARIES

 The operating capacity of such venues will be increased to 50 per cent

SHOPPING MALLS AND SHOWROOMS

 The occupancy limit of such areas will be changed to one person per 10 sq m of gross floor area

- If not, this limit is reduced to 50

TOUR GROUPS

- Up to 50 people will be allowed for tours that involve transport, such as **Duck Tours**
- Groups will remain capped at 20 people for non-conveyance tours

ATTRACTIONS AND CRUISES

 Operating capacity increased to 50 per cent

MICE EVENTS

- Up to 1,000 people may attend these events if they have all been fully vaccinated*
- If not, this limit is reduced to 50
- Certain exceptions for children**

SOLEMNISATIONS AND WEDDING

- Up to 1,000 people may attend wedding solemnisations if they have all been fully vaccinated*
- If not, this limit is reduced to 50
- Certain exceptions for children**

NOTES:

- * People are considered "fully vaccinated" two weeks after they have received a full regimen of the Pfizer-BioNTech/Comirnatry or Moderna vaccines, or any other vaccines under the World Health Organisation's Emergency Use Listing. Those who have recovered from Covid-19 or have obtained a negative result on a pre-event test taken in the 24 hours before the expected end of a group activity are also included in this category.
- ** Unvaccinated children aged 12 and below may be included in a group of up to five persons if all the children are from the same household. For large-scale events, the number of children is capped at 20 per cent of the total event size.
