### Attitudes on climate change Pew Research Centre surveyed more than 16,000 adults in 17 advanced economies, including Singapore, from March to May this year. The majority of respondents were greatly concerned about climate change and that the climate response by the European Union and United Nations earned mostly high praise, while the US and China received poor marks.
